HOSTS

The Nantucket Yacht Club (NYC), Great Harbor Yacht Club (GHYC), Nantucket Community Sailing (NCS), and the Nantucket Race Week (NRW) Committee.

Merchandise for NRW can be ordered and customized in advance at the website and will be available at both yacht clubs during NRW.

1 RULES

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, including Appendix V (Alternative Penalties).

2 ADVERTISING

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organizing Authority.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 Prior to entering, local sailors from NCS, NYC, or GHYC should have approval from their Program Director to participate in the 420 NRW Regatta and to reserve a program boat for this event. Entrants who have not received this approval (it can be verbal) may not be eligible for participation and will be refunded in full.
- 3.2 Sailors from off-island junior/youth programs are encouraged to enter, but should understand that this is a BYOB regatta. Housing and coaching assistance are not provided. Charter club boats may be available, with or without rigs and blades. For charter boat availability, contact the NCS Program Director as shown in NoR 17 below. A charter fee will apply.
- 3.3 Club 420 sailors shall be juniors who have not reached their 19th birthday in 2019.
- 3.4 Nantucket applicants must be approved by their program head:

- 3.5** Sailors will be placed in Green or Championship Fleets according to instructors' recommendation. In general, local sailors who have competed off-island in regattas will be placed in the Championship Fleet while novice 420 racers who have not competed off-island will be placed in the Green Fleet. Visitors should select their Fleet accordingly.
- 3.6** All applicants must complete the entry form, including the waiver and medical, online (click on the Sailing tab) by Sunday, **August 11 at 1800.**
- 3.7** The Organizing Authority, may, in its sole discretion, accept any late entry.
- 3.8** Membership in US Sailing is encouraged.

4 FEES

- 4.1** The entry fee is \$50 per participant, if received on or before **August 1.** The skipper and crew are each required to enter.
- 4.2** Entries and/or fees received after **August 1** are subject to an additional late fee of \$10 for a total of \$60.
- 4.3** The entry fee includes a t-shirt, lunch both days, and one ticket to the Family BBQ and daily Awards Ceremony at GHYC on Monday night. Shirts will be presented on Tuesday at the Awards Ceremony.
- 4.4** The fee for guests for the Monday night cookout will be \$30 per person. Tickets for children (12 and under) are \$15 per person. Tickets may be purchased online or at the entrance to the BBQ at GHYC on Monday evening. Online tickets may be claimed at Will-Call.
- 4.5** Tickets for all NRW social events may be purchased online (click on the Overview/Social Events tab) or at the Regatta Desk located at the NYC. Space is limited. Please make reservations early.
- 4.6** Box lunches and water will be provided to participants on both race days.

Participants who have food allergies should bring their own lunch.

5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions, including the courses to be sailed, will be available online by August 8 and at the Regatta Desk located at the NYC, and at the competitors meeting.

6 SCHEDULE

Monday, August 12

0900-0915	All competitors check-in at NYC
0930	Competitors meeting, NYC
1100	First warning signal
1800	Cookout and daily awards, GHYC

Tuesday, August 13

0900	All competitors meet at their respective sailing facilities to check-in and rig boats
1000	First warning signal
1630	Snacks and Awards, NYC

7 VENUE

The available racing areas inside Nantucket harbor will be shown in the sailing instructions.

8 SCORING

- 8.1** Twelve races are scheduled.
- 8.2** One completed race constitutes a regatta.
- 8.3** When five or more races are completed, one worst score will be excluded, as permitted in RRS 90.3(b), from a boat's series score.

9 SAFETY

All competitors shall wear, while on the water, US Coast Guard approved PFD, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. This changes RRS 40. The penalty for breach of this rule is DSQ, without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1.

11 PRIZES

- 11.1** There will be prizes for both Green Fleet and Championship Fleet.
- 11.2** Day One awards will be presented at the cookout at GHYC on Monday, August 12.
- 11.3** Overall awards will be presented at an Awards Ceremony after racing on Tuesday, August 13 at the NYC. Other awards may be given by the Organizing Authority.
- 11.4** The top-performing skipper in a one-design fleet will also receive a special NRW prize, to be presented Saturday, August 17 at the NYC.

14 BOATS AND EQUIPMENT

- 14.1** The regatta will be sailed in Club 420s supplied by the hosts.
- 14.2** The boats will be supplied by the three participating clubs/organizations and assignments made by program heads.
- 14.3** The boats supplied to the competitors shall not be modified in any way, with the exception of the following:
 - Wind indicators may be taped or tied anywhere on the boat.
 - All fittings or equipment designed to be adjusted may be adjusted within the limits provided.
 - No marks should be made on the boats with pencils, marker or grease pencils, except that they shall be completely washable, leaving no trace of their use.
 - Only non-residue tape may be used.

15 CLEAN REGATTA



Nantucket Race Week is committed to maintaining Nantucket's clean waters and

shores, and is certified by Sailors for the Sea as a gold-level Clean Regatta. All NRW participants are encouraged to follow the goals and requirements of the Clean Regattas program.
